Introduction

- Paul's experience in Athens
 - Athens worships 3,000 gods (Acts 17:16)
 - Paul is provoked by the city's idolatry

Paul's Approach

- Reasoning in the synagogue and marketplace (Acts 17:17)
- Encounter with Epicurean and Stoic philosophers (Acts 17:18)
 - Epicureans: Pursuit of pleasure, avoiding hardship and death
 - Stoics: Belief that everything (good or evil) is God

Key Teachings

- True freedom is not doing whatever you want, but living within God's will
- Modern society's idols
 - Wealth, pleasure, victimization
 - Comparison to media and generational changes

Scriptural References

- Acts 17:22-31
 - Paul preaches about the unknown God
 - God made the world and everything in it
 - God does not dwell in temples made with hands
- Romans 1:18-20
 - God's wrath against ungodliness and unrighteousness
 - God's attributes are evident in creation
- Psalm 19:1-3
 - The heavens declare the glory of God

- Day and night reveal knowledge of God
- Isaiah 53:1-12
 - Prophecy of the Messiah
 - Jesus bore our griefs, carried our sorrows
 - By His stripes, we are healed

Practical Applications

- Recognizing and rejecting modern idols
 - Focus on personal and societal idols
- Importance of sharing the gospel
 - Engage with others thoughtfully and respectfully
 - Understand others' beliefs to effectively communicate God's love
