Sermon Notes

I. Introduction

- **Passages:** Acts 21:15-19 and Luke 5:1-11
- Key Theme: Trusting and obeying God, even when His plans seem challenging or unclear.

II. Key Themes and Discussions

C. Lessons on Faith and Obedience

- **Trust God's Plan:** Even when we are tired, discouraged, or feel like we have nothing left to give, God calls us to trust His guidance.
- **Stepping Into Deeper Waters:** Sometimes, God asks us to go beyond our comfort zones, trusting that He knows what lies ahead.
- **God's Timing and Provision:** Just as Jesus provided the miraculous catch at the right moment, He will provide for us when we follow His lead.
