I. Introduction

Passages: Acts 23:1-5, Hebrews 4:11-16

• Title: Who Is Your Priest?

• **Key Theme:** Jesus is our eternal High Priest, offering direct access to God and interceding for us.

II. Key Themes and Discussions

A. Paul's Confrontation with the High Priest (Acts 23)

- Paul's Boldness: Paul addresses the council with a clear conscience, but the high priest orders him to be struck. Paul responds with righteous indignation, calling out the hypocrisy of the priest.
