Sermon Notes

I. Introduction

• Title: When God Calls You

Passage: Acts 23:1-35

• Key Theme: Understanding and responding to God's call with faith and obedience.

II. Key Themes and Discussions

A. God's Protection

- Paul's Experience: Despite a plot to kill him, Paul is protected by Roman soldiers (Acts 23:12-24).
- Scriptural Assurance:
 - Deuteronomy 31:6 "Be strong and courageous...for the Lord your God goes with you."
 - Psalm 34:7 "The angel of the Lord encamps around those who fear Him."
- Application: God shields believers when they follow His call, removing fear and uncertainty.

B. God's Authority

- Paul's Defense: Paul speaks under the authority of Christ, supported by Roman governance (Acts 23:25-30).
- Scriptural Insight:
 - Matthew 28:18 "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me."
 - Romans 13:1 "Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities."
- Application: Believers are empowered by God's authority, enabling them to act boldly.

C. God's Conveyance (Provision)

- Paul's Journey: Roman forces safely transport Paul to Caesarea (Acts 23:31-35).
- Scriptural Insight:
 - o Exodus 6:6-8 God promises to lead and redeem His people.
 - Numbers 23:19 "Has He spoken, and will He not make it good?"
- Application: God provides everything needed to fulfill His call, including resources and direction.

D. God's Audience

- Broadening Paul's Impact: Opposition increases Paul's opportunities to preach, even to Roman officials.
- Scriptural Insight:
 - Acts 1:8 "You will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, and to the ends of the earth."
 - o 2 Timothy 4:17 "The Lord stood with me...that all the Gentiles might hear."
- Application: God provides the right audience for His message through His servants.

E. Facing Opposition

- Paul's Accusers: Jewish leaders falsely accuse Paul, but God's purpose prevails (Acts 24:1-9).
- Encouragement: Isaiah 43:10 "You are my witnesses...before me there was no God formed."
- Application: Opposition is inevitable but serves to strengthen faith and further God's purposes.

III. Conclusion

- Reflection: What is God calling you to do? Are you willing to step out in faith?
- Encouragement: Trust in God's protection, authority, provision, and purpose. Do not fear opposition; Jesus is greater than any obstacle.
